4-H AWARDS BANQUET INFORMATION

Save The Date! The 4-H Awards Banquet is scheduled for Thursday, September 29th at the Jefferson County Fair Park.

Clover Award

Anyone in 4-H can apply and receive a Clover Award just by participating! The Clover Award program recognizes 4-H members for the things they do in 4-H. By participating in activities members earn points towards five levels of recognition. If you are doing things in 4-H start filling out your Clover Award today! You can earn a Clover Award in one year, or it may take a couple of years. The more active you are the easier it is to get points. Check out the easy to complete application by clicking here - <u>Clover Award</u> Application. Applications are due September 1st.

Project Award

Apply for a Project Award! You may apply for up to 3 project awards per year. Please continue to use whatever method you want to show your growth and leadership in a particular project area. You can make a video, do a scrapbook, write a speech, make a display or be as creative as you want. Project Awards are separate from Record Book Awards. <u>Project</u> <u>Award Applications</u> are due September 1st.

Officer Books

Club officers - Treasurer, Secretary, Reporter/Historian are encouraged to keep a record book throughout the year of the club's happenings. Sample books are available at the EXT Office or on the <u>website</u>. They are due to the EXT office by September 1st.

Key Award

The 4-H Key Award is intended to be the top honor a county can give to any 4-H member. The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award recognizes 4-H participants who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills, and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community. Older 4-H members are encouraged to apply for the 4-H key award. The application is based on participation in activities, an essay showing how 4-H has helped you to gain life skills and the completion of a leadership project. If you are interested in applying or at least starting the application process please check out the application at Key Award Application. Key Award applications are due September 1st.

Record Book Award

Every 4-H member is highly encouraged to complete their year with a Record Book. Please check with your club, as some clubs have a Record Book requirement. Youth wishing to participate in the Record Book Award must have their Record Book turned in to the EXT Office by September 1st. Monday Night Lessons

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE:

- Please sign up each week to attend! Please include the names of all members/grown-ups/leaders/siblings attending-- and horses! <u>The link to the sign-up document is here!</u>
- IMPORTANT If you are not a JCHP member, or a 4H leader, you are considered a "non-JCHP spectator" (eg moms/dads/grandparents/non-4H siblings or friends) and must sign this waiver required by our insurance. You can print it at home and bring it to MNL, or grab a copy at the check-in desk. <u>Waiver Form</u>

PLEASE BRING:

- \$3 per rider
- Coggins (a copy for us to keep--only need to bring once)
- · Helmet, long pants, boots with cut out heel
- A healthy horse (come anyway even if you don't have a horse to bring!)
- Please DO NOT BRING your horse to Fair Park if you have ANY concerns about your horse's wellness. Specifically, do not bring your horse if he/she has a fever, or a thick discharge from either/both nostrils, or has any other medical concerns not yet seen by a vet. If in doubt, don't bring your horse! There will always be activities and educational opportunities at each MNL for those who CAN bring their horses and those who CANNOT.
- If you bring a horse who appears to be sick we will ask you to leave in order to protect all the other horses.

Arrival and Check-in at Fair Park: 6pm-6:30pm Leave your horse in the trailer and check-in by the Announcer's Stand (or just inside the indoor arena if the weather is bad). EVERYONE needs to check-in, and you will need to pay your \$3 and show your Coggins and helmet if you will be riding. Non-JCHP Spectators need a signed waiver (see above). Once you have checked in, you can unload your horse and as soon as you are ready, you may begin to lunge/ warm-up/ride in the arenas (remember - you cannot be mounted unless you are in an arena or just about to enter). Lesson time: 6:30-8pm with possible extended open ride depending on weather and participants.

Exhibit a Project Activity - Enjoy the Fair and Summer!

For those exhibiting at the county fair, it is time to put the finishing touches on your exhibits. The Judging schedule listed, Thursday, July 7, 2-7pm for Natural Sciences -Dept #16. Double check which items you signed up to exhibit. Print the pages from the Fair Book for Dept 16. Read the general Rules and any special ones listed for the Divisions. Locate and highlight the specific information you need to know for exhibiting at the fair. Be sure you are presenting the items or information listed for the Class number you signed up to exhibit.

Cloverbuds- Future Exhibitors, Dept 100, Division L are also listed for Thursday, July 7, 2-7pm Judging.

Double Check for any Judging Schedule **changes** on the Fair Park Website.

Enjoy the summer and take pictures and make notes of all the things you enjoy. Take time to sit and watch the birds and bugs as you have a snack. Listen for the wind in the leaves of the trees or smell the campfire at night when camping. Maybe just feel the tree bark with your fingertips. Or even just lay in the grass and watch the clouds go floating by. Make up a poem about what you see. Enjoy your backyard or beyond with friends or on vacation.

Hopefully your **house plants** are growing well and you have figured how to plant some **garden** even with our crazy spring.

Enjoy them and prepare them for your Fair exhibit. Keep a close eye on them! Changes to them can happen quickly. Protect them, the best you can, from weather and insect damage. (tip-try using row cover materials or sturdy containers/covers in case of storms)

For those exhibiting at the county fair, the Judging schedule listed, Tuesday, July 11, 10am-2pm for Plants & Soils-Dept #14 and Flowers & House Plants -Dept 15. Also, Cloverbuds-Future Exhibitors - Dept 100, Divisions J and K. Double Check for any Judging Schedule changes on the Fair Park Website. Copy it and post it where you can see it.

Double check what you signed up to exhibit. If you have not printed the pages from the Fair Book for Dept 14 Plant & Soil Sciences and Dept 15 Flowers. I encourage you to do so. Mark and Read Carefully how to prepare each of your entries. Make a card for each entry, listing the details for that entry and use it as you prepare your exhibit. Take it to the Fair with you for a reference as you talk to the judge.

Note rule #6 under Dept 15 asks for a note card identifying plants and flowers being exhibited. Make a copy from the Fair Book and have it with your exhibit or take the information with you and fill one out when you check in your exhibit. If you need help you may contact Sharon. (see below)

Also use <u>A2935</u> Evaluating & Judging Flowers & Indoor Plants or <u>A3306</u> Exhibiting and Judging Vegetables as a guides for preparing your exhibit. Remember they are guides for preparing and not the details for our county exhibits. If you have not seen or printed them go to the website *learningstore.uwex.edu*. Choose view PDF and download the publication to save and/or print. Keep for a hands on references.

Most of all, Enjoy your plants and gardening with your family. May you have wonderful fresh vegetables for snacks and dinners.

You may want to try some successive planting or do some companion planting for late summer, early fall fresh vegetables.

Companion Planting with Bush Beans may be a gardening experiment that would be interesting to do.

Compact bush beans provide plenty of **creative companion planting options** in any type of garden. In intensive **raised bed gardens**, you might anchor the ends of double rows of bush snap beans or filet beans with summer savory or upright dill plants, two herbs often paired with green beans in the kitchen. **Or, try this companion planting idea intended to protect beans from pests.** Plant bush beans after spring radishes, cilantro or arugula, with a few of the bolting plants left behind. Radish, cilantro and arugula flowers attract beneficial insects, and can help to confuse pests in search of beans. You can also interplant bush beans with onions to deter pests from both crops.

Enjoy your fresh garden vegetables, **smell** your flowers and **smile** about your house plants. Hope to see some at the Fair or send me pictures!
