4-H Enrollment

<u>4-H Dues:</u> 4-H members pay dues to the Jefferson County Leader's Association and Jefferson County. The Leader's Association dues are \$5 per person. However, the county still requires a \$20 fee that goes towards our programming and supplies. The Jefferson County dues are on a sliding scale. This means that families will be charged \$20 for the first child, \$15 for the second child, \$15 for the third child and \$10 for each child after that. This chart is included in the 4-H Family Guide. If there are any question about the county dues please contact the EXT office. Like last year, fees to participate in our program will come directly to the Extension Office. Your family will be sent an invoice after enrollment closes unless your club is paying all enrollment fees. Call the Extension Office if you have questions!

Most options come in multiple colors. Items will be received around the first week of December. There are two different ordering options:

Orders placed through the county are due November 4; money and order must be received by November 4. You will be notified when your order is available for pickup. Celebration is an important part of the goal process. Recognizing accomplishments unifies 4-H members around an outcome, reminds them to focus on the positive, and motivates them to create new goals. Wisconsin 4-H promotes celebrating your successes through the offering of grants to clubs and groups that met their 2021 Charter SMART goals.

Did your Wisconsin 4-H club or group meet their 2021 charter SMART goals? Apply for a Wisconsin Chartered 4-H Club and Group SMART Goal Grant and celebrate with your members and those who helped you meet the goal.

Funds are available to celebrate as a club or group your success! Approximately 30 grants will be awarded for the following amounts \$100, \$200, or \$300.

Grantees will be contacted after December 12, 2022 if they will be awarded the funds to celebrate their SMART goal success! Clubs and groups will be selected based on the level of youth involvement in the goal planning, actionable steps/ objectives to reach the goal and the celebration plans.

Your club or group can decide how to spend the SMART goal celebration funds.

We ask in return for the grant funds that you send us a photo and caption telling us how the funds were used to celebrate the club's SMART goal success. We may share your story on social media and in the WI 4-H newsletter.

Countywide Project Volunteer Opportunities

The new 4-H year has begun! We are in search of volunteers who want to help expand educational opportunities in the County.

Our youth have stated they want more hands-on learning and project improvement programing. We hope to add volunteers with the skills to provide more in-depth education and take some of the burden off the shoulders of club leaders. We have a lot of very talented individuals in the County whose knowledge would be a great asset to our youth.

We highly encourage youth to also sign up. Many of you have

great skills sets to teach and lead projects. This is a great way to gain tangible leadership skills. Remember, colleges and employers are no longer looking at how many things you participate in but the depth of a few things you are in.

There are multiple ways to volunteer, and each with its own time requirements.

- Committee Representatives: Attend most of the monthly meetings, we understand sometimes life gets in the way. Participate in countywide project learning planning. Attend Project Learning Days and special events.
- Project Leader: Hold at least four hands on learning sessions between October 1 and June 1. Participate in countywide project learning planning. Be available for questions. Note: current project leaders who do not hold four learning sessions will be considered inactive.
- Mentors: Can take many shapes and forms depending on time availability. Mentors should have strong skill sets in their area and be able to answer questions and help youth trouble shoot problems.
- Project Learning Days and Special Events
 Educator: Lead classes during Project Learning Days or educational events.
- Foster Farm Leader: Critical for expanding access and education about food and agriculture. Foster farm leaders provide a place for youth who do not have access to land to complete projects. This can be livestock projects, fruits, vegetables, crops or beekeeping.
- Club Project Leader: Many of you are already doing this
 on the club level. Club project leaders tailor learning to a
 club's level and provide the club information on what is
 happening county-wide.

Natural Sciences, Plants & Soils Projects

<u>In November</u> all project and interested 4-H members are invited to meet with the Duck Creek 4-H Club to Create a Take Home Item using Natural Materials <u>Tuesday</u>, November 15th, 7:00-8pm at St Coletta Cabin.

Directions to St. Coletta's Cabin: 434 Highway Y, Jefferson. Take the driveway just south of Jefferson Memory Care (414 Highway Y) up the hill and turn right at the T intersection and continue to the cabin's parking lot.

Natural materials such as berries, cones, flower or weed pods, grape vines, or live greens can be used to create a plant craft item.

This activity will provide skills for identification of plant materials and a fun time creating simple Fall, Christmas or Winter decoration. You may bring clean dry cones or seed pods, if you have some. Look for Milk Weed Pods or other seeds pods while we still have good weather.

Celebrate the Arts

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will sponsor the art contest, open to any current Wisconsin 4-H member, with cash prizes totaling nearly \$1,000. The contest will be held virtually, with photos of all entries submitted electronically.

Although the contest is virtual, the winning art, selected to be in the arts auction, from each category and the Best of Show must be delivered to the nearest 4-H Office or the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation. These items will become the property of the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation and will not be returned. In addition, photos or likenesses of all entries may be used by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation to promote the 4-H program and/or to raise funds for the Wisconsin 4-H program.

The contest will be broken into nine categories. Artists are <u>STRONGLY</u> encouraged to create art that has a 4-H theme or has root in their 4-H experience (example: a photo taken on a 4-H trip or of another 4-H member working on a 4-H project; a painting inspired by a 4-H event; pottery that incorporates the clover). Artists will be asked to share the details of their inspiration and the 4-H connection as part of the entry process. The 4-H connection to the contest entry will be a part of the evaluation criteria.

A winner will be chosen in each category with a Best of Show award given to one entry chosen by the judging committee. Category winners will receive a \$100 cash award. The Best of Show entry will receive an additional \$150 cash award. Winners will be notified by email by February 1. A complete winner's list, as well as photos of the winning entries, will be on the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Website by February 15, 2021.

To be eligible for the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Art Contest, youth must be a 4-H member enrolled in 4H Online for the 2022-2023 4-H Program Year. Entrants do <u>not</u> need to be enrolled in any specific project to participate.

One of those five finalists will be chosen as the grand prize winner.

In addition to an ice cream party, the grand prize winner will also receive a \$500 prize for their 4-H Club. The winning flavor will also be produced in summer 2023 as a Feature Flavor for the month of July. The winning flavor will be available in parlors that scoop Cedar Crest Ice Cream.

Who: All 4-H Clubs in the State of Wisconsin are eligible.

What: Wisconsin 4-H clubs are invited to collaborate to imagine a delicious new ice cream flavor, and come up with an interesting flavor name. Each club may submit up to five entries.

When: Entries must be submitted to Cedar Crest Ice Cream no later than November 15, 2022, via online entry form or email.

Bird Migration Explorer

Audubon officially launched the Bird Migration Explorer that is now public at <u>birdmigrationexplorer.org</u> and in Spanish at <u>exploraves.org</u>.

The Bird Migration Explorer will be the first-of-its-kind interactive, free digital platform to combine multiple types of migration and conservation data for hundreds (458 to be exact) of species of migratory birds mapped at a hemispheric and local level. It reveals insights about the journeys of individual species, the connectedness, through migratory birds, of any given location in the hemisphere, and also details how migratory birds encounter 19 different conservation challenges.

The Bird Migration Explorer can also show *when* each of these species passes through a location, and the extent to which each of those species overlaps with any number of conservation challenges such as light pollution or power lines along their journeys. More generally, a user can see how

countries in the Americas all are connected to each other by migratory birds, underscoring the importance of international cooperation and collaboration in the research and conservation of these species.
