Record the cycles of life happening around you and have information for a Science Fair or County Fair exhibit. They will be in your backyard and all the place you go. Take time to enjoy them.

Plants & Soils Project

Plant & Soils Projects include these project areas – Crops, Vegetables, Flowers, Houseplants and Plant Crafts.

Hopefully your house plants are growing well and you have figured how to plant some garden even with our crazy spring. Enjoy them and/or prepare some as a Fair exhibit. Keep a close eye on them! Changes to them can happen quickly. Protect them, the best you can, from weather and insect damage. (tip—try using row cover materials)

Sign up exhibits by June 1. Then double check what you signed up to exhibit. If you have not printed the pages from the Fair Book for **Dept 14 Plant & Soil Sciences and Dept 15 Flowers.** I encourage you to do so. **Mark and Read Carefully** how to prepare each of your entries. **Make a card** for each entry, listing the details for that entry and use it as you prepare your exhibit. Take it to the Fair with you for a reference as you talk to the judge. Also mark your calendar with the judging dates and times. Cloverbud members are the Future Exhibitors. Their judging is listed for June. Check the Fair website for any changes. See Dept 100 Future Exhibitors, Divisions J and K under Open Class Non-Animal Exhibits (if you have a Cloverbud in the family).

Note rule #6 under Dept 15 asks for a note card identifying plants and flowers being exhibited. Make a copy from the Fair Book and have it with your exhibit or take the information with you and fill one out when you check in your exhibit.. If you need help you may contact Sharon. (see below)

Also use <u>A2935</u> Evaluating & Judging Flowers & Indoor <u>Plants</u> and <u>A3306</u> Exhibiting & Judging Vegetables.as a guide for preparing your exhibit.

Most of all Enjoy your plants and gardening with your family. You may want to experiment with successive planting or do some companion planting.

Compact bush beans provide plenty of **creative companion planting options** in any type of garden. In intensive **raised bed gardens**, you might anchor the ends of double rows of bush snap beans with summer savory or upright dill plants, two herbs often paired with green beans in the kitchen. **Bush snap beans** work well when interplanted **with potatoes**, which are usually up and growing by the time the soil is warm enough to plant beans. After your potatoes have been weeded and hilled, plant bush beans down the outside of the row. As the potatoes die back, the beans will help keep the soil shaded and cool.

Or, try this companion planting idea intended to protect beans from pests. Plant bush beans after spring radishes, cilantro or arugula, with a few of the bolting plants left behind. Radish, cilantro and arugula flowers attract beneficial insects, and can help to confuse pests in search of beans. You can also inter plant bush beans with onions to deter pests from both crops.

Enjoy your good garden vegetables and smell your flowers. Send me pictures! May you have a great summer.

Poultry Project

Poultry and eggs exhibited at fairs or poultry shows must show that they participate in one of the following:

• National Poultry Improvement Plan program. Provide documentation to the exhibition of your NPIP flock certification.

• Wisconsin Tested Flock. Provide documentation to the exhibition that your entire flock of sexually mature birds tested negative for pullorum-typhoid and, in the case of turkeys, Mycoplasma gallisepticum, on a Wisconsin Tested Flock form. A sexually mature bird is a bird over 4 months old; with turkeys, it is a bird over 6 months old. The Wisconsin Tested Flock form is valid one year from the date that tests were conducted.

• Wisconsin Associate Flock. Provide to the exhibition your

Wisconsin Associate Flock form and supporting proof of purchase (e.g., invoice) showing that all of the birds or bird eggs in the flock were acquired directly from a flock enrolled under the NPIP, Wisconsin Tested Flock or Wisconsin Associate Flock.

• Test poultry individually using the Individual Poultry Test Report form. Provide documentation to the exhibition that your individual sexually mature birds tested negative for pullorum-typhoid and, in the case of turkeys, Mycoplasma gallisepticum, within the preceding 90 days, and there has been no change of ownership of any birds since the completion of testing. A sexually mature bird is a bird over 4 months old; with turkeys, it is a bird over 6 months old. Testing for purposes of a fair or poultry show shall be completed before the birds arrive at the event.

A Jefferson County 4-H Poultry Project Pullorum-typhoid testing clinic will be held on **Saturday June 17, 2023 8am-10am**location TBD. Please save the date and plan to attend if you need your chickens tested for the fair. This clinic will be free of charge to all Jefferson County 4-H Poultry Project members.

If you are unable to attend this clinic please check the DATCP website<u>https://datcp.wi.gov/Documents/</u> <u>PullorumTesters.pdf</u> for a list of testers. Please keep in mind the testers on the list may not be available to test private flocks and will likely charge for testing.

Rocketry

The rocketry (aerospace) project will meet the second and fourth Thursdays of the month at 6:30 p.m. at the Extension Office (March-May). The project meetings in June will be held on June 8 and June 22.

Youth must be able to safely use an X-Acto knife or be accompanied by an adult who will assist the youth with cutting rocket parts.

In addition to making rockets from kits, youth also will have the opportunity to make rockets from scratch. The rocketry project is seeking donations of Pringles cans, sturdy cardboard tubes longer than 9 inches (such as aluminum foil tubes), and balsa wood.

The Livestock Point Card is for the sole purpose of Livestock Awards, Project Grants & Trips. The Point Card is not linked to the Jefferson County Fair. *The only exception is the Dairy Point Card which is required to participate in the Showmanship Jackpot at the Fair.

Mandatory items listed on the Livestock Point Card are **required** in order to be eligible for Livestock Awards

It encompasses the whole 4-H year. Points must be obtained between September 1 through August 30. It is due to the Extension Office by August 31.

In order to exhibit at the Jefferson County as a 4-H'er youth MUST be a member in good standing. Meaning youth are enrolled in the Jefferson County 4-H program & have paid their dues.
