

The Scott E. Skalitzky Memorial Scholarship Fund

The scholarship fund was established after Scott's death from cancer in October of 2008. Scott had received various scholarships and awards upon his high school graduation; he went on to Madison college and received a degree. He completed his career at Waste Management as plant manager changing garbage into electricity. The electricity helped give power from Watertown all the way to Beloit. His family and friends thought this scholarship would be a wonderful way to carry on his legacy. In the past ten years, over 60 awards have been given to 4-H/FFA/USA members who have similar goals and attributes. These four areas for future study may be a certificate, one, two or four years of study in agriculture, mechanics, conservation and any area of medical. They need to be graduating from an area in Jefferson, Dodge, Dane, Columbia or Waukesha counties.

The scholarship committee meets to review the applicants and give awards ranging from \$ 500.00 to \$1200.00. The students are presented the scholarship at their high school awards program.

All donations are used to help promote Plow Day; vintage tractor plowing, tractor ride and field demonstrations. In the evening, a rib-eye and chicken barb-que is served followed by an auction and raffles. Any donations receive a receipt and the EIN number.

Establishment- The Scott E. Skalitzky Memorial Scholarship has been established to deserving graduates to continue their education in the areas of: **Agriculture, Mechanics, Natural Resources or any area of Medical.**

Scholarship Requirements:

Full time senior enrolled in a high school within area that Scott worked

Student must have been enrolled for at least two consecutive semesters prior to graduation.

An FFA or 4-H member in good standing

Applicant must have applied and/or been accepted in certified program in the above listed criteria

Three letters of recommendation from the following: teacher of counselor; 4-H or FFA advisor; a community member

Awarding of Funds The recipient will be notified by their school by April 15 of his/her award and their name will be in a new news release and the scholarship presentation. The scholarship monies will be disbursed **DIRECTLY** to the individual upon completion of the first semester as a full time student. The student must maintain a **2.0 GPA** . A copy of your first semester transcript is required for verification.
