




## Calling all Lego Lovers!

#### 2025 Agricultural grant applications are now available

The Jefferson County Agri-Business Club is pleased to offer the opportunity for local agricultural-related groups to apply for a grant to "jump start" some activity or special project that is not covered within your group's regular budget. The Club has awarded grants to local agricultural organizations for many years. The funds are generated from the Club's county fair food stand and our holiday cheese and meat sales.

To apply, fill out the 2024-25 Grant Application form, found on the Club's website, <u>jeffersoncountyagribusinessclub.com</u>. After submitting the paperwork, due no later than **December 31, 2024**, potential grant recipients will be asked to present their proposed project to the Club membership at our January 21, 2025 meeting and answer questions about the project's details. The meeting will be held at Fairview Sports Bar and Banquet Facility in Jefferson.

## 2025 Agri-Business scholarship applications now available

Jefferson County Agri-Business Club provides college scholarships to local youth pursuing a career in agriculture. Students wanting to apply can download an application from the club website, <u>www.jeffersoncountyagribusinessclub.com</u>. The application includes student activities, leadership, work experience, transcript, essays about agriculture, and letter of recommendation. Students can be seniors in high school or currently enrolled in college. Monies are awarded to youth attending 2-year, 4-year, or technical schools. The deadline for submission is February 1, 2025.

Jones Dairy Farm donated all the ticket sales from their 2022 Jones Yellow Barn Centennial Celebration to the club's scholarship fund. "This donation allows our organization to assist more local students pursuing careers in agriculture by helping to fund their college educations," stated Bill Blossfeld, Jefferson County Agri-Business Club president. The top 2025 scholarship applicant will receive the Jones Dairy Farm Agriculture Scholarship.

In addition, memorial monies were donated to the Jefferson County Agri-Business Club in honor of retired Jefferson High School agriculture teacher and FFA advisor, Will Larson. He also managed the St. Coletta's farm in Jefferson. In recognition of his involvement in the Jefferson County Agri-Business Club, friends and family donated funds to start this special scholarship within the organization to which he dedicated many years. A scholarship bearing his name will be awarded to a student pursuing a degree in agricultural education with the goal of becoming an ag teacher.

The Grants/Scholarship committee reviews and scores the applications. They present their recommendations to membership at the February meeting for final approval. The



Jefferson County Agri-Business Club will honor students with scholarships at their April 2025 meeting. The evening will include a catered meal and the scholarship presentations at Fairview Sports Bar & Grill in Jefferson.

Funds to finance this venture are raised throughout the year primarily from the food stand at the Jefferson County Fair and an annual cheese sale prior to the Christmas holiday. Community members can also purchase cheese and meat at the Fort Atkinson Holiday Open House and Market on December 7. The club also maintains a vending location at Pleasant Valley Acres Grain and Produce Farm in Sullivan from mid-November to mid-December.
