

Jefferson County Farm Bureau Scholarship

Scholarship Applications Available for Local Students Jefferson County – Jefferson County Farm Bureau is now accepting applications for its annual scholarship program. The scholarship is available to graduating high school and current college/technical school students who will continue their education in 2025-2026. The purpose of this scholarship is to provide financial assistance toward the cost of higher education.

To be eligible, students must be the son or daughter of a Jefferson County Farm Bureau member and pursuing higher education from an accredited college, university, or technical school. Applications are due on April 1 and are available at local high schools or from the Jefferson County Farm Bureau webpage.

Wisconsin Towns Association Scholarship

Your thoughts – combined with your writing skills and creativity – can put you in line to receive one of seven scholarships. **Rural Mutual Insurance Company**, Wisconsin Towns Association, and **Scott Construction**, Inc. are again offering the following scholarships to winners of an essay contest. Scholarships will be awarded on the following basis:

Two (2) **\$1,000** scholarships will be awarded to the students with the highest-ranking essay score from a town or village insured by Rural Mutual Insurance Company (town must be insured as of May 1, 2025).

Jefferson County WFTD Scholarship

The Executive Committee of the 2019 Jefferson County Wisconsin Farm Technology Days show has announced that applications are now being accepted for their sixth round of student scholarships.

Applicant Eligibility

Applicants are required to fully complete the online application, including essay. A digital copy of a current transcript noting cumulative GPA for all completed high school semesters will need to be uploaded.

January 1- March 15, 2025

All applicants will be notified of their status 4-6 weeks after the March 15th deadline. This is a competitive scholarship program. Not all eligible applicants will be awarded a scholarship.

Scholarship Awards

Scholarship awards will be paid directly to recipient's college or university for the next academic year.

Who's Got the Beat!

As we settle into the rhythms of winter it is a perfect time to think about art and our next major 4-H State Arts activity, **Art Beat!** Actually, when isn't a good time to think about art. Art Beat is for any 4-H member in grades 3-5 and will be held at Upham woods March 15-16. You can register through 4-H online. **Applications will be open January 20-February 17 or until the camp fills**.

What is it?

Art Beat is a 4-H, hands on, interactive art experience in beautiful Upham Woods in the Wisconsin Dells. Participants will learn to juggle, make visual arts, create a STEAM project, explore music and much, much more. Art Beat is led by 4-H older youth and professional artists in a variety of disciplines from painting, theater, textiles, and music. 4-Hers will also get to experience an overnight camp adventure. **The goal for Art Beat is to help young people to explore their artistic sparks.**

When is it?

Art Beat begins at 9:00 Saturday morning, March 15 and will wrap up after lunch on Sunday, March 16. This year we are also offering overnight lodging on Friday evening, for an additional cost, to help with those that may have too far to travel Saturday morning. Along with art activities, 4-Hers will also participate in traditional camp activities like campfire, spirit contest and counselor-led fun.

Cost

Based on the success of Arts Camp pricing, we will again offer a tiered price structure. Our goal is to make Art Beat more accessible to more youth. Whether you choose the highest or lowest tier, you will get the same great 4-H programming. \$100, \$125, \$145 are the three tiers. \$125 is the closest actual cost of the program. We are also asking volunteers who spend the night to pay \$75 which covers food and lodging to help control costs for all youth participants. Please contact your local 4-H educator about scholarship opportunities at the county or Leader's Association level. State Scholarship opportunities are also available. It is also possible that your local 4-H club will help with the cost.

You will help to provide leadership in the cabins and rotate through each of the art tracks. 
Wisconsin Ag in the Classroom Contest
