Natural Science Project

2025 March Activities for Natural Science- all Natural Resources & Environmental Education Projects

Projects include Beekeeping, Birds, Insects, Fishing, Forestry, Wildflowers, Hunting & Wildlife, Adventures, and Environmental projects.

No meeting date set at this time. Watch for updates.

Is it winter or spring? March is so unpredictable. Are you like March or have you chosen what Natural Science project you are doing?

Do you know you can do a poster or display exhibit about weather as a Natural Science project. You could show a chart showing the different cloud forms or a calendar of the daily weather for a month and tell how it compared to last year. Or choose special weather conditions to illustrate as how a tornado forms.

Birds will be returning soon. They will be looking for food, shelter, and water. Some will stay, other will continue north as weather changes. International Migratory Bird Day will be celebrated in May at Dorothy Carens Park with the "Big Sit" by the Friends of Rose Lake. But don't wait until May to start watching for the male Red Wing Blackbirds. Mark down the date they arrive and keep a record of all the birds you see. List the dates and location you see them.

The Sandhill Cranes also come back early. You may hear them before you see them, Be listening. Their call is very different. You can't miss it. They look a light gray in early arrival, changing to their brown color later,

Other birds will be arriving soon and some stayed all winter. What bird is your favorite? What kind of nesting place does it need? Could you build a birdhouse for it? Look up what size of nestbox and entrance hole is recommended. Build the house and place it in the proper place and see what happens. Make the second birdhouse for exhibiting at Fair with information about the bird it was built for. That would make a neat bird project exhibit! Add food and water in

your yard and you will have provided a home for your favorite bird.

There are many other natural science projects topics. From fishing to wildlife management and explaining why it is important to catch and release some fish species or to have hunting or trapping of mammals. There are projects about different tree species and the importance of wildflowers for all pollinators.

For questions on these or any other projects, please text or email to discuss. If I don't have answers, I'll try to find someone who can help answer your question so I can also learn.

Plant & Soils Science Project 2025 March Activities for Plant & Soils Sciences Projects

Plant and Soils Projects include these project areas – Crops, Vegetables, Flowers, House plants and Plant Crafts.

Meeting Pending----Watch for Update

Its time to start the seeds of early plants that like cold or need time to **germinate**. Create a starter "pot" from tissue rolls and start those seeds now. **Or plant** native flower seeds that **need stratification** by being in cold temperature outside.

Are you caring for a houseplant or thinking about planting a garden?

Or will your family be planting a field crop of soybeans or corn?

If you answer yes to these questions, you are ready to plan what to do

during March. The weather is on a roller coaster but you can be on a

solid path.

Start today to check seed catalogs, websites of seed companies, or stores for the seeds you choose to plant. **It is suggested** to plant favorite seed varieties and ones that can grow in conditions of drought and high temperatures.

Now is preparing time. Make a list of the plants or seeds that are interesting in catalogs, websites or stores. Put the ones you would like to grow or the ones you want to eat, on your list. Find vegetables or flowers with funny or strange names. When visiting seed displays at stores purchase early or order from the companies you trust.

Will you be choosing to **exhibit** flowers or vegetables **at the County Fair**? You'll need to know how many growing days are there before fair. Also, you will want to know which flower or vegetable varieties are best for exhibiting or just growing in Wisconsin. These guides can help you find that information. They were **A1653** Planting Guide, **A3383** Containers. **Download** and/or **Print** your copies of that info from the Learning Store at learningstore.uwex.edu Also, **Download** and/or **Print** copies of **A2935** Evaluating & Judging Flowers & Indoor Plants and **A3306** Exhibiting & Judging Vegetables. All of these have information for good growing practices and what is needed to be informed about fair entries. *Click on View Pdf.*

For houseplants there is a *UW Garden Fact sheet* (XHT1033)Houseplant Care available at hort.uwex.edu/ articles/houseplant-care/. Check it out and print it for future reference.

To help choose what houseplant, flowers, vegetables or field crops to exhibit, go to the Jefferson County Fair website and find Plant & Soil Sciences Dept and Flowers & Houseplants Dept in the Fair Book under Junior exhibitor class. Download and/or Print those pages for references. All of these guides can be used by/for 4-H Cloverbuds to grow and enjoy a plant project or do a fair exhibit. For County Fair, Cloverbuds were listed as Future Exhibitors under the Open Class Exhibitors

No place to grow a patch of popcorn or sunflowers? Ask for the possibility to

plant them at another club members home. Or you may like to plant **Teddybear Sunflowers** for Birds, Bees and Butterflies, the **Pollinators** we need so we have foods to eat and flowers to enjoy. **Consider planting some Native Plants as Host Plants for Caterpillars and Butterflies.**

Consider sharing gardening information by making exhibits or doing demonstrations. They could be about different ways to garden, like "Hydroponics". Or a poster display of a "Flowering Plant Life Cycle" or one about "Soil Types". These exhibits could be a school project, a special Science Fair exhibit and still be entered as a project exhibit at the County Fair.

Make your lists and plans. Get your pots and containers ready to plant. Do some "winter sowing" or sprinkle some radish and kale seed in a small garden space and see when it will come up. Mark it with seed name and date planted.

Jefferson County Farm Bureau Scholarship

Scholarship Applications Available for Local Students Jefferson County – Jefferson County Farm Bureau is now accepting applications for its annual scholarship program. The scholarship is available to graduating high school and current college/technical school students who will continue their education in 2025-2026. The purpose of this scholarship is to provide financial assistance toward the cost of higher education.

To be eligible, students must be the son or daughter of a Jefferson County Farm Bureau member and pursuing higher education from an accredited college, university, or technical school. Applications are due on April 1 and are available at local high schools or from the Jefferson County Farm Bureau webpage.

Wisconsin Towns Association Scholarship

Your thoughts – combined with your writing skills and creativity – can put you in line to receive one of seven scholarships. 
