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#### **Congratulations Jefferson County Livestock Judging Team!**

The Jefferson County 4-H junior and senior livestock judging teams competed in the Area Animal Science Days (AASD) on June 30<sup>th</sup> in Chilton and the State 4-H Livestock Judging contest on July 21<sup>st</sup> in Lodi. Jefferson County had 27 4-H members who judged this year. Jefferson County had the most livestock judgers of any county at the AASD.

The junior team members were: Gavin Boettcher, Greylen Boettcher, Gretta Boettcher, Jacob Beauchamp, Gracelyn Bishop, Nate Flood, Fynnley Gefvert, Piper Gefvert, Mallory Gefvert, Hayden Gevert, Ella Greving, Elliot Hanus, Hayley Reu, Cheyenne Pautz, Carter Pernat.

The senior team members were: Aubrey Beauchamp, Rylee Brattlie, Megan Doherty, Gracelnn Dolph, Olivia Dolph, Peyton Grev-

ing, Kya Kelleher, Aiden Mindemann, Gabe Mindemann, Keilah Reu, Elliott Small, Vivian Stahl.

At the AASD, the junior team of Ella Greving, Gavin Boettcher, Nate Flood, and Fynnley Gefvert placed 4<sup>th</sup>. Ella Greving placed 10<sup>th</sup> individually. The senior team of Elliott Small, Vivian Stahl, Gabe Mindemann, and Aiden Mindemann placed 2<sup>nd</sup>. Elliott Small placed 5<sup>th</sup> individually. In reasons, the senior team placed first and individually-Gabe Mindemann placed 1<sup>st</sup>, Aiden Mindemann placed 4<sup>th</sup>, and Elliot Small placed 9<sup>th</sup>. Both teams advanced to the state contest.

At the State 4-H contest, the junior team placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall. Gavin Boettcher placed 1<sup>st</sup> individually overall. The team placed 4<sup>th</sup> in beef, sheep and goats, and reasons. Gavin Boettcher placed 1<sup>st</sup> in beef and reasons, 3<sup>rd</sup> in sheep and goats. Fynnley Gefvert placed 8<sup>th</sup> in sheep and goats.

The senior team placed 2<sup>nd</sup> overall. Aiden Mindemann placed first overall individually. Gabe Mindemann placed

4<sup>th</sup>, Elliott Small placed 10<sup>th</sup> and Vivian Stahl placed 11<sup>th</sup>. The team placed 1<sup>st</sup> in reasons and sheep and goats, 2<sup>nd</sup> in beef, and 3<sup>rd</sup> in swine. Individually, Aiden placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in beef and reasons, 3<sup>rd</sup> in sheep and goats, Gabe Mindemann placed 1<sup>st</sup> in reasons, 2<sup>nd</sup> in swine, 5<sup>th</sup> in sheep and goats, Elliott Small placed 4<sup>th</sup> in sheep and goats and 5<sup>th</sup> in reasons. The senior team earned a livestock judging rip to the National Western Livestock Show in January 2026 in Denver Colorado.

#### **Awards Banquet Program Cover Contest**

Calling All 4-H member! Do you like to draw? Would you like your art work showcased at the countywide level? Here's your chance to help design the Program Cover for the upcoming 4-H Awards Banquet! We are looking for handdrawn (not digital) cover art that features our theme "Beyond Ready". All drawings should be 8 1/2 x 11 and must be submitted to the Leaders Board via the UWEX no later than September 15th. Winner will be selected at the September Board meeting.

#### **Clover Award**

Anyone in 4-H can apply and receive a Clover Award just by participating! The Clover Award program recognizes 4-H members for the things they do in 4-H. By participating in activities members earn points towards five levels of recognition. If you are doing things in 4-H start filling out your Clover Award today! You can earn a Clover Award in one year, or it may take a couple of years. The more active you are the easier it is to get points. Check out the easy to complete application by clicking here - Clover Award Application. Applications are due September 1st.

#### **Project Award**

Apply for a Project Award! You may apply for up to 3 project awards per year. Please continue to use whatever method you want to show your growth and leadership in a particular project area. You can make a video, do a scrapbook, write a speech, make a display or be as creative as you want. Project Awards are separate from Record Book Awards. Project Award Applications are due September 1st.

#### Officer Books

Officer Books Club officers - Treasurer, Secretary, Reporter/ Historian are encouraged to keep a record book throughout the year of the club's happenings. Sample books are available at the EXT Office or on the <a href="website">website</a>. They are due to the EXT office by September 1st.

#### **Kev Award**

The 4-H Key Award is intended to be the top honor a county can give to any 4-H member. The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award recognizes 4-H participants who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills, and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community. Older 4-H members are encouraged to apply for the 4-H key award. The application is based on participation in activities, an essay showing how 4-H has helped you to gain life skills and the completion of a leadership project. If you are interested in applying or at least starting the application process please contact the Extension Office. Key Award applications are due September 1st.

#### **Record Book Award**

Every 4-H member is highly encouraged to complete their year with a Record Book. Please check with your club, as some clubs have a Record Book requirement. Youth wishing to participate in the Record Book Award must have their Record Book turned in to the EXT Office by September 1st. Your club leader can bring it in, or you can bring it in as an individual. Click here for the Member Record Book.

#### **Nominations Sought for 4-H Volunteers**

This year we will be awarding TWO Volunteer Awards at the Awards Celebration. The "Volunteer of the Year Award" (a volunteer 10 years or less) and "Lifetime Volunteer of the Year Award" (A volunteer over 10 years of service). Often leaders are not comfortable nominating themselves, but each of us has worked with some outstanding volunteers. Click here for the Volunteer of the Year Nomination Form. Nominations are due by September 1st.

#### Friend of 4-H Award

We are looking for individuals and businesses who go above and beyond to help the 4-H program through their donations of service, time, money, etc. Do you know of someone who is not a leader or member but does so much for 4-H? Or someone who is a leader or member but does things for 4-H as part of their occupation? Nominate them for the Friend of 4-H Award. #### **Green and Gold Award**

Do you have a volunteer, youth or adult, in your club that goes above and beyond? Nominate them for the Green and Gold Award. This award may be given to youth and certified leaders within your club that have demonstrated a consistent effort of volunteer services to their club, county, project and/or the association. Nominations are due by September 1st.

#### 4-H Community Servant Award "My Hands to Larger Service"

The 2nd H in the 4-H Pledge is about pledging our hands to service. 4-H clubs (and members) who complete Community Service events in the name of 4-H should be honored for the things they do. Each club should complete the "My Hands to Larger Service" log to record the things that club members and your club as a whole do throughout the year. The clubs with the highest percentage of involvement will receive a monetary award. Each club who completes the log will be honored for their service. #### 4-H Dues

# 4-H Project Grant Applications Due September 15

The Jefferson County 4-H Leaders Association sponsors the opportunity for youth to apply for grant funding to support their project work for the upcoming 4-H year. Youth may apply for multiple projects but are only eligible to be awarded one project grant annually. Number of project grants awarded depends on available funds. Applications will be reviewed and decided upon by the Grant Award Committee.

#### **Grant Information:**

- Grants will be awarded for initiating or improving project program.
- Recipients will be determined by the grants award committee, based on this application information. The Leaders Association will award 10-15 grants.
- All grants are in the form of cash awards (checks) issued to recipients.
- All grants are paid to the recipient with the understanding that the award funds will be used to meet expenses of improving or starting their project.
- All grant monies must be expensed by August 31, 2026.
- It is understood that anyone awarded a Project Grant will complete a Final Report in order to be eligible for any future Project Grants. Final Report will explain how your grant funding was utilized for your project.

#### **Grant Requirements:**

- Application MUST be completed in full.
- Current year application must be utilized.
- Applicant must be in 3rd through 12th grade during the 2025-2026 school year.
- Applicant must be a current member of Jefferson County 4-H Program.
- Application must be signed by applicant, parent/guardian and club leader.
- No other materials outside of application may be attached.
- Limit one grant per 4-H'er per 4-H/project year.

#### **Grant Areas:**

- Beginner (1-4 years in project)
- Intermediate (5-8 years in project)
- Advanced (9-12 years in project)

#### Selection Announcement:

• Recipients will be notified by the Extension, Jefferson County Office by email and letter in December.

#### How to Apply:

- Complete the entire form through Seamless Docs (electronically).
- Upload one photograph related to your project. The applicant is requested to be in the photo. Applications must be turned in by 4 p.m. on September 15, 2025.
